Watching Super Bowl XL via TV this past weekend made me homesick for my family still living north of Detroit. Reading the information on your website brought back a flood of childhood memories from the 1950's and 1960's. My parents' first home was in the 7 Mile and Dequindre area, where we walked home from school for lunch, and walked to the nearby Wrigley's for groceries, including Awery's baked goods. Our neighborhood consisted of Eastern European working class families, and it was fun for me to ride my bike around suppertime to smell the different ethnic foods being cooked. Our family moved to the west side of Detroit in 1962 (7 Mile between James Couzens and Greenfield area) and I learned to drive in Northland Shopping Center's empty parking lot on Sunday afternoons (Do you remember when most businesses were closed on Sundays and holidays?) My summer jobs while living in Detroit included Cunningham's Drug Store clerk and merchandise stock clerk at Montgomery Wards. My husband of 35 years also grew up in Detroit, where his Grandfather, uncle, and dad operated a wholesale florist. For decades it was located on Montcalm in downtown Detroit, but that land is now the home plate at Comerica Ballpark. NORDLIE, INC. continues to provide floral supplies to suburban Detroit. Some of our fondest memories were "field trips": to the Ford Rotunda to see Santa; to Detroit Institute of Art; to watch the polar bears at the Detroit Zoo; to be at the Michigan State Fair with our Girl Scout troup; to go ice skating at Palmer Park; to ride the boat to Bob-lo Island; Shrine Circus, Ice Capades, etc. But the two VERY SPECIAL DETROIT MEMORIES were "dress-up" events: #1. Wearing white gloves, black patent leather shoes with lace ankle socks, fancy hat, and best Sunday dress, ride the DSR bus to downtown J L Hudson's with my sainted Grandmother, take a person- operated elevator up to the diningroom for Maurice Salad with Vernors Ginger Ale (dessert was at Sander's for hot fudge cream puff). #2. Our steak & champaign engagement dinner at the Top of the Flame rotating restaurant overlooking the Detroit River. I remember the "old neighborhood" back in Detroit. There was Scotty's Fish and Chips located on Livernois south of Fenkell. They held a parade once a year (probably on the 4th of July). Detroit also had the street cars that ran on Livernois. Every Sunday, there were two TV shows, the Black Spider and later, the White Camelia. They ran old movies. The Black Spider and White Camelia were the hosts of the TV shows. Prior to the Ghoul, there was a Friday night show, "Shock Theater", hosted by a scary looking guy who kind of played his role a little more seriously than the Ghoul. Of course, as far as TV shows, there was Space Cadet and Captain Video, but they were syndicated. In the "old Detroit", there were businesses located near the downtown area where you could always find most anything you wanted "wholesale"...kind of a standing joke, but nevertheless true. Detroit's Good Humor trucks weren't the first ice cream vendors I recall. The vendors before that rode tricycles, the front of which had a cooler loaded with the ice cream. It wasn't that unusual to see horse-drawn junk wagons in Detroit. During the summer, my parents would go over to Borin Brothers Ice Company to pick up a block of ice to put in a cooler to take on picnics. During the winter, you could count on the coal company to come by and drop off a load of coal in the coal bin. I also remember the cost of admission to the Saturday matinees: 12 cents, and that included two movies and a cartoon. One of the other restaurants (or hangouts), was Cupid's Bow located across from Mumford High School. Those were the good old days...for the most part.
